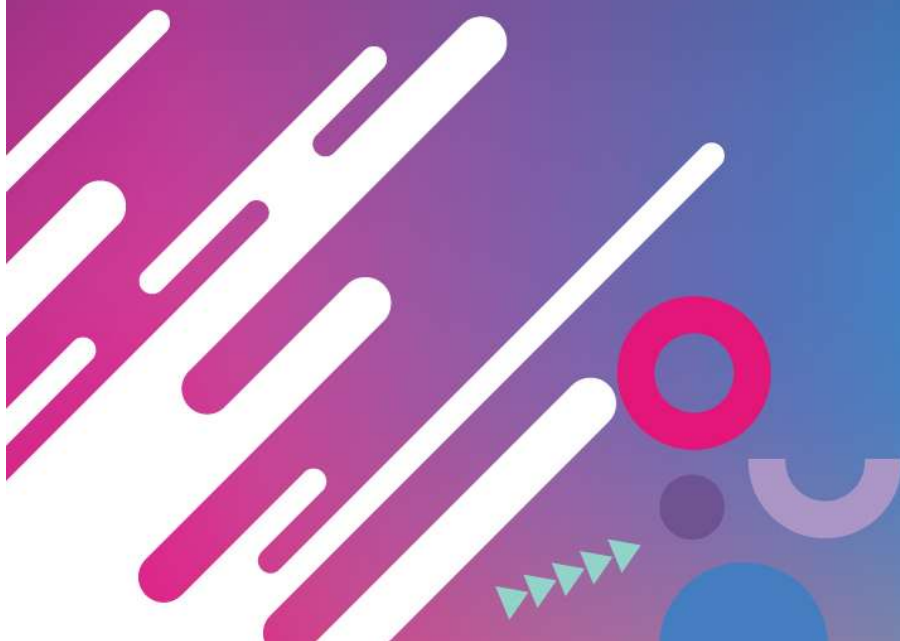

WEEE and Batteries Take Back Policy

Business to Business (B2B) WEEE

Hammer Distribution is a producer of electrical and electronic equipment for users other than private households with the registration number: WEE/HG0196VQ. Where required by applicable legislation, Hammer Distribution will finance the treatment, recovery and environmentally sound disposal of qualifying waste electrical and electronic equipment (“WEEE”), under the following conditions:

- Where electrical and electronic equipment first placed on the market by any manufacturer, distributor, or reseller before 13 August 2005 is being replaced with equipment of the same type or performing the same function supplied by Hammer Distribution.
- Where the electrical and electronic equipment consists entirely of equipment originally supplied by Hammer Distribution on or after 13 August 2005.

For equipment purchased after 13th August 2005, the original producer retains responsibility for financing the collection, treatment, recovery, and recycling of WEEE—unless a contractual agreement states otherwise.

Customers wishing to utilise this take-back arrangement must deliver the WEEE to the facility nominated by Hammer Distribution unless otherwise agreed. Once received, we will cover any further treatment or recycling expenses. To arrange a collection contact compliance@hammerdistribution.com

Industrial Batteries

Hammer Distribution is classed as a producer of batteries with the registration number: BPRN11602. Hammer Distribution will take back waste industrial batteries free of charge from an end user under the following circumstances:

- If you purchase new industrial batteries embedded in a product supplied by Hammer Distribution within the same calendar year as the new batteries being purchased.
- If you cannot return waste industrial batteries to the original supplier, and where the battery chemistry is the same chemistry as those we supply in our products —or have supplied over the last three years.
- If no other producer is available to accept the return.

This might occur when you are not purchasing new batteries and the battery chemistry in question has not been offered on the market for several years, making it impossible to locate an appropriate producer. To arrange a collection contact compliance@hammerdistribution.com

Portable (Household) Batteries

Hammer Distribution does not sell loose batteries, but we do supply equipment that may contain portable batteries, specifically CR2032 coin batteries. Therefore, we offer a free recycling service for household batteries. A battery box is installed at our main operational site at Basingstoke, making it easy and convenient for you to dispose of your used batteries safely. Please note that this service is available only for portable, common consumer household batteries such as AA, AAA, C, and D.
